Letters will be (or already have been) sent home giving more information of your child's performance and any costume that your child may need. Please note, there is absolutely **NO EXPECTATION** for you to buy costumes! If you do not have anything suitable, please speak to your child's class teacher and we will try to source a costume from within school.

As always, we shall be filming the Christmas performance dress rehearsals and DVD's/USB's will be available to purchase either via pre-order or on the day of the performance. We shall also take a photo of each class in their performance costumes which will be available to purchase and may be featured in the local newspapers (those children without consent will not appear in the newspaper). Order forms will be sent out nearer the time.

Please note that no filming or photography may take place during the Christmas performances. This will provide a more comfortable and enjoyable experience for you as in previous years many have complained that their view was obstructed by other people's recording devices. There will be an opportunity at the end of each performance for you to take pictures of your child for your own personal use.

DVD's/USB's and class photos will be sold for your own personal use only and may not under any circumstances be uploaded to any social media sites nor shown publicly.

New School - Could we ask all parents/carers to only use the new school email address, communicated with Mrs South's introduction letter (info@newprimschool.co.uk), to suggest new school names only at this time. If you have any concerns, please send these to the relevant current school. Thank you.

Unnamed Uniform - We have lots of unnamed jumpers and cardigans - please reclaim a jumper and rename it! Also, please check that all your child's clothes are named - they often rub/wash off!

Toys in School - Could we please ask that children do not bring toys into school with them unless this has been previously agreed with the class teacher as a transitional object. We cannot be held responsible for any toys which are lost, damaged or swapped in school.

Cough into Elbows - At school, particularly during this season of coughs and colds, we encourage the children to cough into their elbows. Please talk to you child and encourage this, to help minimise to spread of germs. Thank you!

Library - All children have the opportunity to visit the school library once a fortnight when they are able to borrow a library book to take home with them. Please ensure that these books are read and returned ready to be swapped, as they will not be able to borrow a new book unless the previously borrowed book is returned. ☺

Singing Lessons - RRS Music Management and Vocal Coaching are offering 1:1 singing lessons during school hours on Mondays, and group sessions during school hours on Tuesdays. The 1:1 sessions have 1 space available at a cost of £15 for half an hour session. Group sessions of 3-4 children cost £7 for half an hour. There is currently 1 space available in the group sessions.

When booking your child's hot meal through ParentPay, please **do not** book a "Chartwells Trip Lunch" instead of a hot lunch. This is only an option if your child is out of school on a school trip and does not mean that your child will get a packed lunch provided at school.

Some parent/carers are ordering lunches through ParentPay but then sending their child into school with a packed lunch. Please refrain from doing this as it results in food wastage.

Also, when making your meal selection, please have a conversation with your child to ensure that the selections are for meals that your child will eat. You have the option on ParentPay to change selected meals (within specified timescales) if you find that your child does not like them.

Reception children also need to be able to use a knife and fork independently - please practise at home.
