Non-Pupil Day - A reminder that Monday 19<sup>th</sup> February is a non-pupil day, so we look forward to welcoming everyone back to school on **Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> February**.

<u>Half Term Reading Challenge</u> - We would like the children to produce a 'Reading River' of their reading habits over the half term holiday. A 'Reading River' is a journey of all the different types of reading that children come across during a week. This could be reading the words on a street sign, reading instructions in a game and listening to a story at bedtime. An information sheet giving some examples of 'Reading Rivers' has been sent home to you this week. Every child who presents a 'Reading River' will receive a certificate and they will be displayed on the wall in the hall. Please hand them to your child's class teacher by Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> February.

<u>Internet Safety Day</u> - Tuesday was Internet Safety Day with a focus on "Together for a better internet". Years 1 & 2 communicated with children at Chesswood via email to find out more about our schools. Reception were reminded about how to stay safe online.

<u>World Book Day</u> - Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March is World Book Day! The children will be invited to come to school dressed as a book character. **There is absolutely no expectation for a costume to be purchased**, it could be as simple as a home-made mask. The books 'The Gruffalo' and 'Giraffes Can't Dance' are both 25 years old this year so you could take inspiration from one of these, but children are welcome to come to school dressed as any book character that they like! Could children please bring in a copy of the book that their character is from or draw a picture of them, so that they can discuss their book character in school.

My Child At School (MCAS) - If you have signed up to the MCAS app, any school communication, including text messages, will be received through the app. Please ensure that you have switched on your notifications for the app in your mobile phone settings so that you receive any communications in a timely manner. If you are unsure, please speak to the school office.

<u>Cough into Elbows</u> - At school, particularly during this season of coughs and colds, we encourage the children to cough into their elbows. Please talk to you child and encourage this, to help minimise the spread of germs. Thank you!

<u>Guitar & Ukulele Lessons</u> - Mr Marchant, our after-school music club provider, is offering to tutor Guitar and Ukulele lessons during school hours on Fridays (**Year 1 & 2 children only**).

There are still limited spaces available for the Spring term. Group sessions of 3-4 children cost £7 for half an hour. Pupils will need to bring their own guitar or ukulele to each lesson. #### Reception

<u>General</u> - What a wonderful half term! Please check the school website to see what we have been doing this half term and what we have planned for next half term. After the break, we are lucky to have Kerry from Wannado Street Dance coming in to teach our P.E. lessons. All of Reception will have P.E. on a Thursday for the next half term.

<u>Forest School</u> - This week you should have received a letter advising that the Reception children will have weekly forest school sessions with Mrs Eales after the half term break on a Friday. The children do not need to wear school uniform on these days, but will need appropriate outside warm/waterproof clothing. They will need wellington boots or shoes/boots you do not mind getting dirty because we will work outside in all weathers.

Occupation Dress-Up Day - It was so lovely to see all of the children in their "Occupation" costumes today.

They all looked amazing!



<u>Real Heroes</u> - This week we were very lucky to be visited by nurse Claire to talk to the children about her job. She talked the about working at the hospital, how to stay fit and healthy and about eating lots of fruit and vegetables. She reminded the children about the importance of covering their mouths when they cough and washing hands. She also showed the children a Finger Oximeter machine used to measure pulse.



#### Year 1

<u>New Topic</u> - After half term, Year 1 will begin their new topic; "What Can We Learn About The Great Outdoors?". In Science the children will be finding out about trees and plants, and in Geography they will be learning about maps, as well as human and physical features in our local environment.

<u>St George's Church Visit</u> - As part of the RE curriculum, the Year 1 children will be going on an educational visit to enhance their learning about Christianity. On Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> March the Year 1 children will be visiting St George's church to learn more about the features of a church and how Christians worship. You will receive a letter soon giving more details. Please ensure that you give permission for this trip as your child will be unable to take part without it.

<u>Phonics & Reading Meeting</u> – You should have received a letter advising that on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March we are inviting all Year 1 parents/carers to a phonics and reading meeting in the school hall at <u>either</u> 9:00am or 2:15pm. The meeting will last approximately 45 mins. We will explain how we teach phonics and reading at Lyndhurst and provide you with ideas to support your child with their reading at home. We will also explain what the 'Phonics Screener' is and what the expectations for your child will be in the Summer term. There will be an opportunity to ask questions but we ask you to return the slip on the bottom of the letter so we can ensure all enquires are answered within the session.

<u>Homework</u> - Maths and Phonics tasks have been sent home in homework books and these are due to be handed in by Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> February, with new tasks being set the following day.
